BS107 Hebrew 1B *(BD elective/BTh elective)*

Hebrew is best studied for the whole year, that is, completing both BS106 Hebrew 1A in semester 1 and BS107 Hebrew 1B in semester 2. It comprises three one hour lectures over different days. The Hebrew 1 unit aims to begin students on a life of study of the Hebrew Old Testament and the message it conveys.
